News from the CSPS

After eight years on the Editorial Board, the years during which the *CQ* solidified its reputation as a quality poetry journal, Jeanne Wagner has announced her retirement. Her first issue was Vol. 34 No. 4 (2008 Fall) and her most recent, Vol. 42 No. 3 (2016 Summer). Among several other issues, Jeanne edited one of the two double volumes produced during the "catch-up" year of 2012—that is, Vol. 38 Nos. 3 & 4 (2012 Summer & Fall). She has also served as a proofreader since 2012 and for the past several years she has coordinated the submission of our CSPS nominations for the Pushcart Prize. We will miss her, of course, but we wish her *much* success in her future endeavors!

Editorial Chair Pearl Karrer edited *CQ* Vol. 42 No. 4 and reports a nice response from Kit Kennedy, one of the contributors: "I have been savoring CQ Volume 42, Number 4. I especially love the conversations that so many of the poems seem to be having with each other. I love your 'Poinsettia.' [On the front, and perfect art for the holiday season—JFH] Thank you for including my two poems."

The CQ is becoming known in Europe for its translations. German poet Karl Greisinger was mentioned in an article of the *Augsburg News* as follows:

Karl Greisinger, Bertolt Brecht specialist and professed 'literature freak', can be very proud. From his volume "Den Tagen das Licht" [Light for the Days], published in 2014 by the Wiesenburg Verlag, the poem "Ozeannacht" was translated in the United States, in July 2016. The quarterly poetry journal *California Quarterly* printed "Ocean Night," the only German poem to be translated in this issue."

The poem, translated by Margaret Saine, was published in the *CQ* Vol.42 No. 4.

CQ Editor Margaret Saine conducted a well-received poetry reading at the Bolton Hall Museum in Tujunga on Sunday afternoon, February 26th. She read from her recent book of poems, *Lit Angels*, published by Moonrise Press and for sale on <u>Lulu.com</u>.

On a personal note, *The Hand of the Midnight Moon*, a collection of my poems from 1964 through the last two years or so, was published in March. It's available on Amazon. ©

Contests, Contest Databases and Others

The CSPS Monthly Contest winners in 2016 and the titles of the winning poems are listed in the Attachment to this *Newsbriefs*. The monthly contest topics and rules for 2017 are the same as they are for 2016; they are posted on the website and included in this mailing. Four of last year's monthly contests had sufficient participation (\$100 or more in reading fees) for monetary awards to all three placing poets (\$50, \$10 and \$5).

The CSPS has not heretofore announced the judges for its Annual Contests, an unfortunate practice we intend to rectify this year and henceforth. It is an oversight I am embarrassed to admit, because we have had *many* outstanding and highly accomplished judges over the years and identifying them would have generated a great deal more excitement for and participation in the contests. In any case, I am delighted to announce that the poet Kevin Hearle will act as the judge for the 2017 CSPS Annual Poetry Contest.

He has earned degrees from Stanford University, the University of Iowa and, finally, a PhD in Literature from the University of California at Santa Cruz. He has taught at several colleges, including UC Santa Cruz, San Jose State University, Notre Dame de Namur, and Santa Clara University. A noted Steinbeck scholar, he won the Burkhardt Award in 2005. For the five years ending in 2013 he served as a Visiting Scholar at the *Bill Lane Center for the American West* at Stanford, where he shared his passion for California literature and history. He began writing poetry in 1979. His poems have appeared widely in journals such as *The Yale Review* and *The Georgia Review* and in anthologies such as *A Bird as Black as the Sun: California Poets on Crows & Ravens*. His book of poems, *Each Thing We Know Is Changed Because We Know It*, was published by Ahsahta Press in 1994.

We began accepting submissions for the CSPS 2017 Annual Poetry Contest on March 1st and will continue accepting them through June 30th. Reading fees are \$3 a poem for members and \$6 a poem for nonmembers. Winning poems will be published in the fourth issue of the *CQ* this year (Vol. 43 No. 4).
